


Instructions how to fill in the form:





Resultaten: concrete acties op alle niveaus

- Strategisch:
 - Health equity en HL implementeren in strategische documenten, onderdeel maken van kwaliteitsbeleid
- Managent:
 - Aandacht HL inbedden op afdeling, onderzoek naar patiënttevredenheid
- Professionals:
 - training in HL herkennen, tool implementeren om HL needs te identificeren, ...

- The conversational approach
- Health literacy in a multidimensional perspective

RELEVANCE OF CHAT IN PRACTICE SETTINGS

- ✓ Easy adaptable in healthcare environments
- ✓ Support health workers to engage with patients about specific health literacy strengths and challenges
- ✓ Questions in CHAT can interpret for immediate decision making in care plans
- ✓ Flexible design

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
